



Anti Bullying Workshop

- Ignore them, or pretend you didn't hear them.
- If you do talk to the bully, respond evenly and firmly
- Turn their comment into a joke
- Walk away, remove yourself from the situation
- Write down the details, keep track 0
- Go and talk to an adult

Students also used Chrome books to learn coding.




